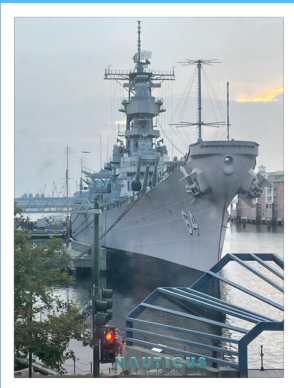
Be Internet Awesome

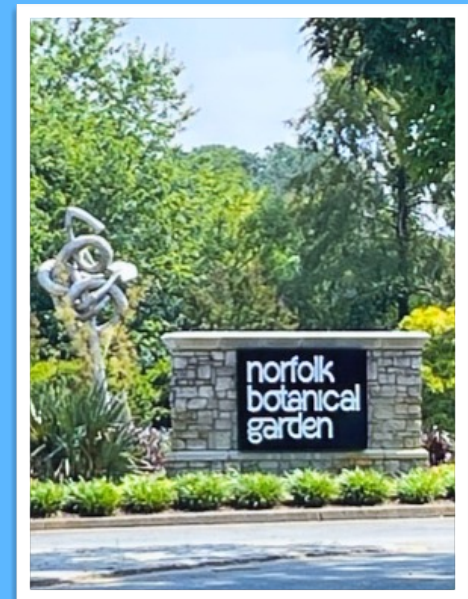

The City of Norfolk is home to over 230,000 individuals. Approximately, 19% of those individuals are persons under the age of 18. That means there are over 43,000 children alone in Norfolk. Protecting them and their health is the forefront of all parent's decisions and internet safety is becoming more prevalent.

The City of Norfolk has many programs for children ranging from toddler to adolescent. These programs are offered by the city and can be found by checking out the City of Norfolk's website. You can also find many programs for younger children at the Norfolk Public Library. They have seven different programs that help your toddler develop "phonological awareness, increase eye-hand coordination, and encourages body awareness." This is their Babygarten program and many others designed for the benefit of your child. The best way to ensure your child is internet safe is to reduce the amount of time they are active on their devices. Joining a program or visiting an attraction in your area can be one of the best decisions for your child and their internet safety.
